

INSTALLING BATTERIES & USING THE POWERCORD


Your Guardzilla Outdoor 180 camera can be powered in either of two ways:

1. Using 4 AA batteries (not included). NOTE: AA L91 Lithium batteries are strongly recommended. Alkaline or other battery types will compromise performance.
2. Using included power cable, which plugs into a standard power outlet.

INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

- 1 To open the battery compartment, grasp both the front and back halves of the camera. Slide the front section upwards while pushing down on the back section as shown in the below illustration. Separate the two halves. NOTE: the first time you access your camera's battery compartment the weatherproof seal may stick and require extra pressure in order to slide open.




- 2 The back section of the camera contains the battery compartment. Open the compartment by lifting the small tab at the bottom of the battery compartment door.



- 3 Insert the batteries into the compartment, following the positioning in the below illustration. Close the

battery door and reassemble the front and back halves of the camera. The status light on the front of the camera will briefly turn on. If not, check that the batteries are installed in the correct position and ensure that you are using fresh batteries.



USING THE POWERCORD

- 1 A 3 meter power cable is included. NOTE: Only use the power cable and adaptor included with the camera. Using other cables or power supplies will impact performance and may damage your camera. If using the cable for power, **do not install batteries in the camera.**

- 2 Locate the small rubber panel at the bottom of the back of the camera and pull open to access the camera's power port. Insert the small end of the cable, making sure that the plug is securely in place. Plug the power cord adaptor into a standard power outlet. The status light on the front of the camera will
